The style of the Orangery at Kensington suggests that it might have been designed through a unique collaboration by Nicholas Hawksmoor, the resident Clerk of Works, and Sir John Vanburgh. The level of decoration reflects its intended use, not just as a 'greenhouse' but as a 'summer supper house' and a place for entertaining.

KENSINGTON PALACE

North Drawing Room

One of the most important rooms in the Palace; it was here in 1819 that the Duchess of Kent gave birth to a daughter, Alexandrina Victoria. The room has recently been restored to appear as it would have done in 1819, creating a unique historic atmosphere for an intimate dinner, reception or presentation.

The Queen's Gallery

Following a restoration programme these rooms have been restored to their former glory. The Queen's Gallery represents a more private side of Palace life and includes Queen Mary's dining room and closet.

Lower Hall

The Orangery at Kensington Palace

Built for Queen Anne in 1704 in the grounds of Kensington gardens. The graceful interior lends itself to formal dinners and it was here that Queen Anne entertained her court. Exceptionally pleasant and memorable venue situated within its own private gardens and royal atmosphere.

The Red Saloon

It was the room in which the Victorian age began, the young Queen Victoria held her first Privy Council meeting here. Steeped in royal history provides a magnificent back drop for receptions or dinners.

The State Apartments

Opened in 1899 intended as a gallery for the finest pictures in the Royal Collection. Made up of the King's Gallery and Queen's Apartments that present a more private side of royal life including Queen Mary's dining room.

The Teck Saloon

Exquisite design and decoration this room lends itself to intimate dinners. Decorated in the style of a royal apartment in the 1860s.
